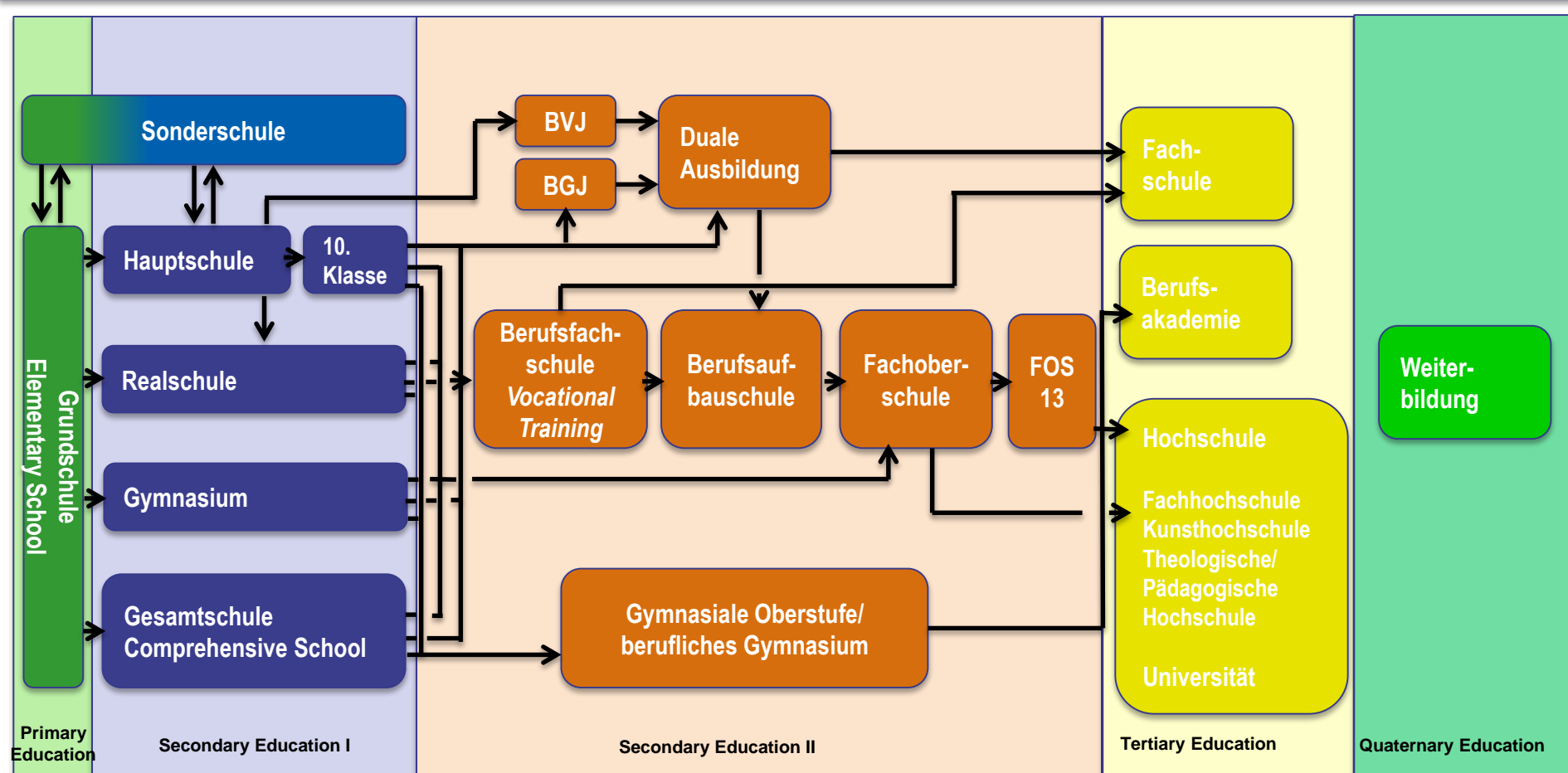

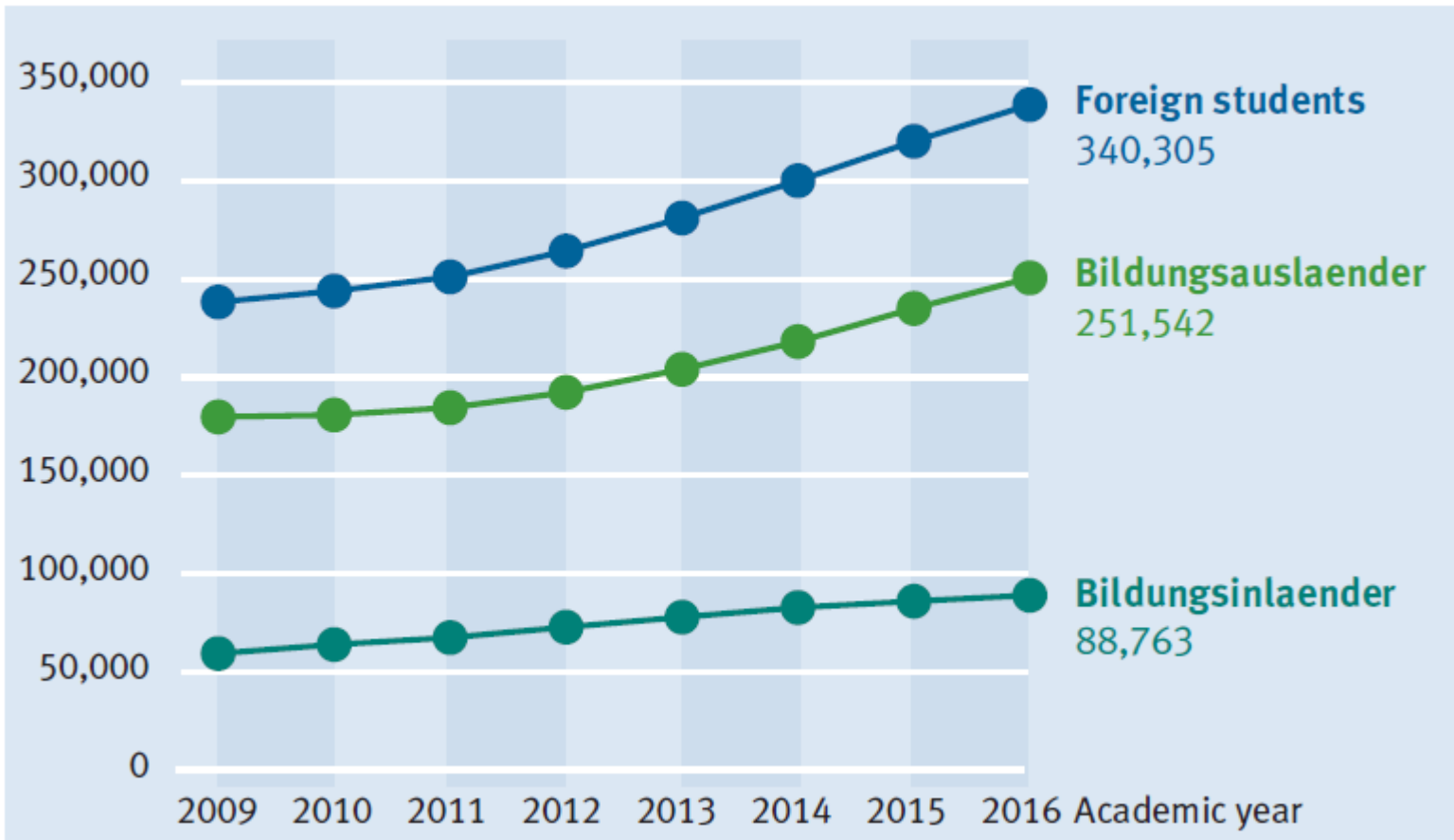

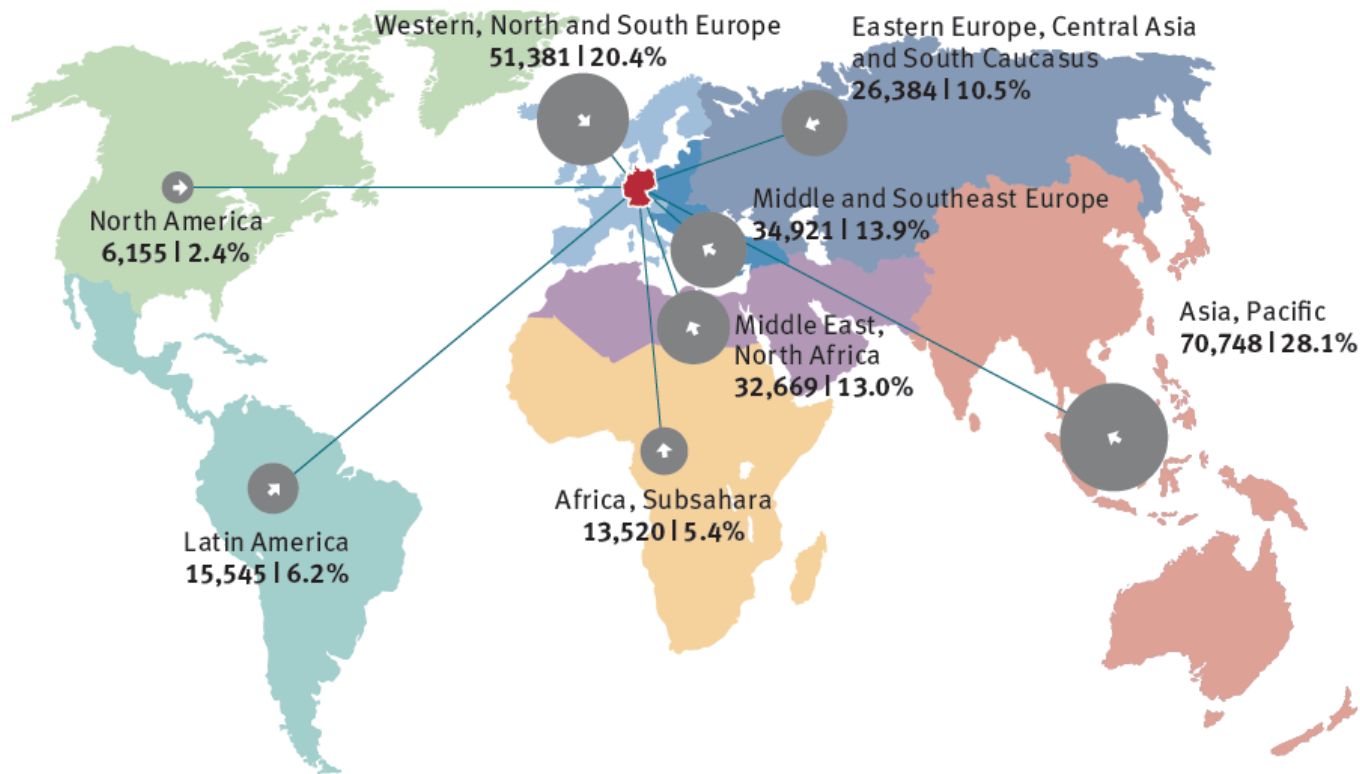

Bildungsauslaender in 2016 by Region of Origin

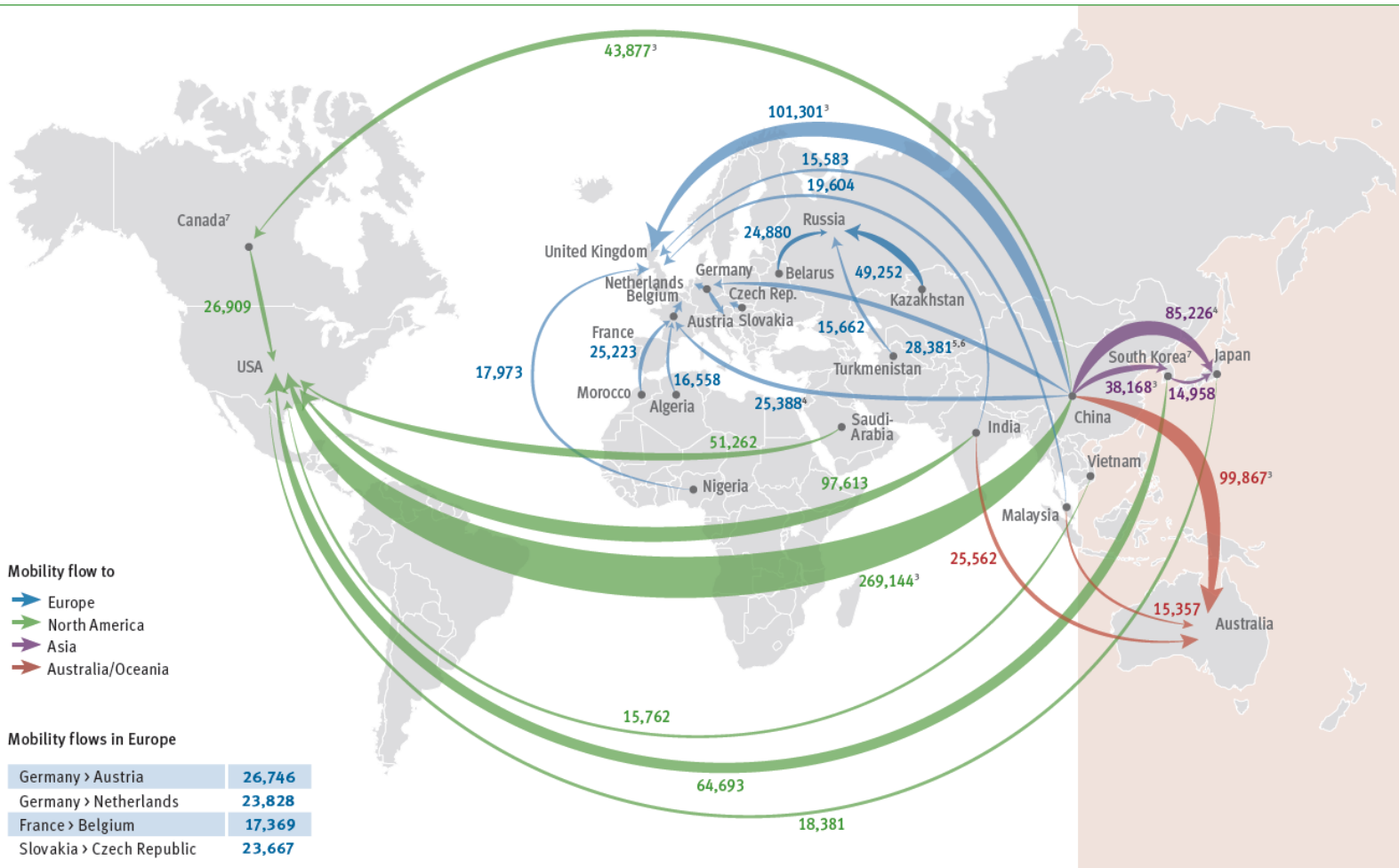

 - ❖ 52 Academies of Art and Music – 1 % student population

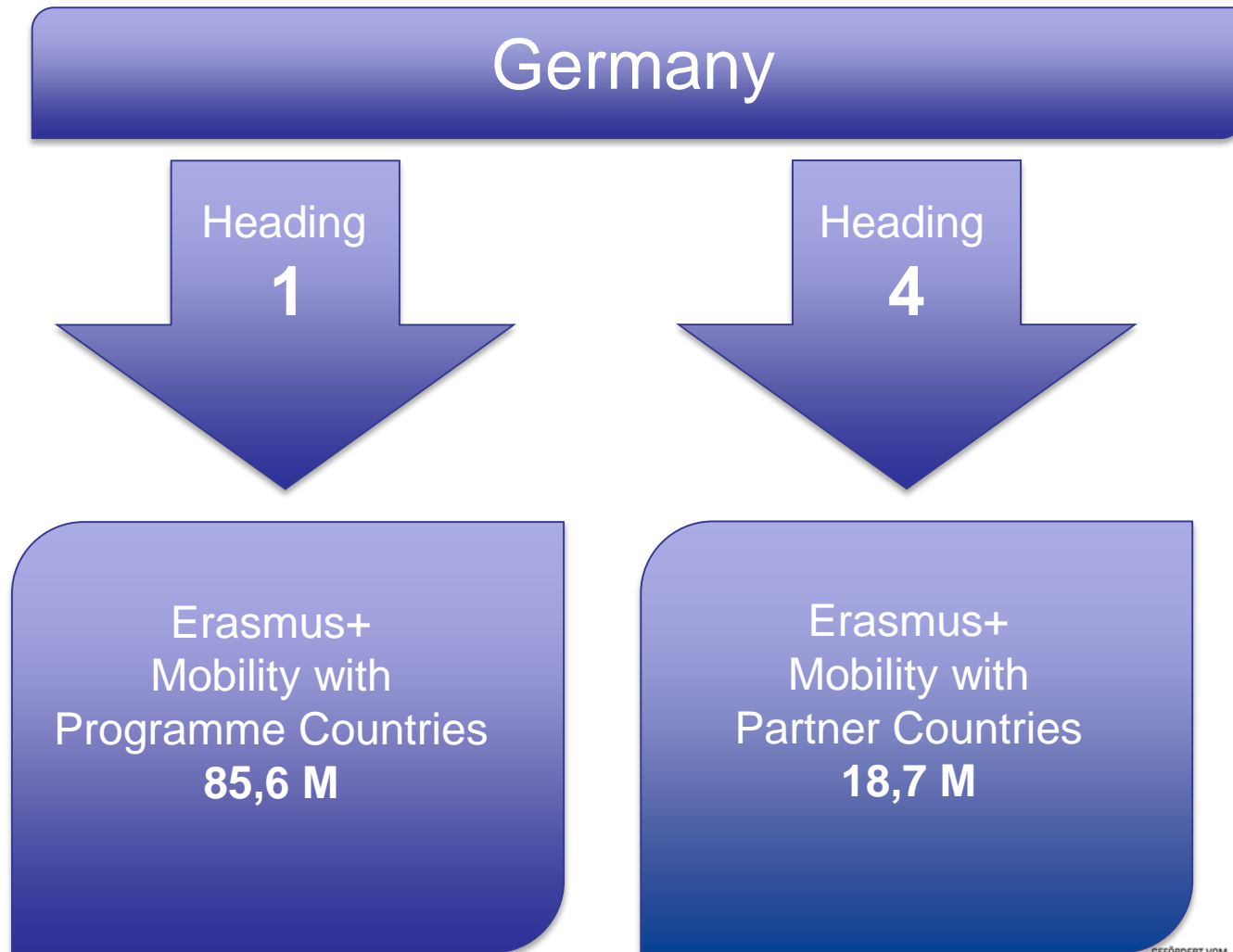

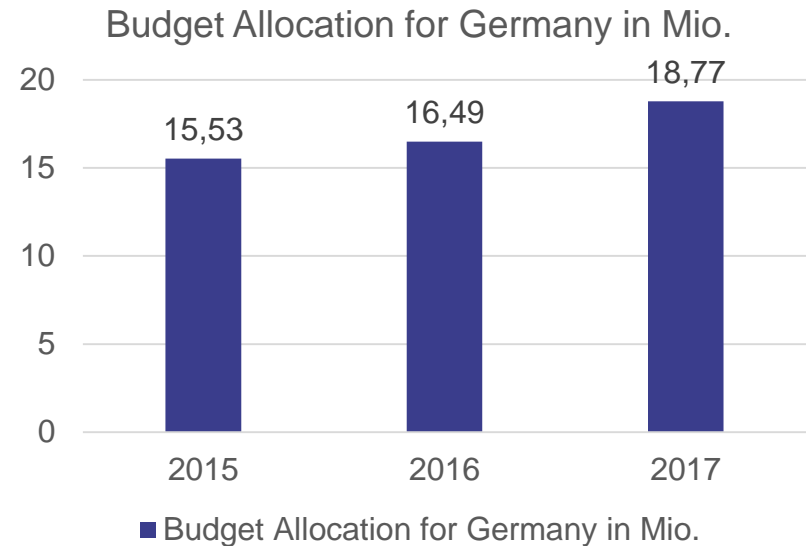

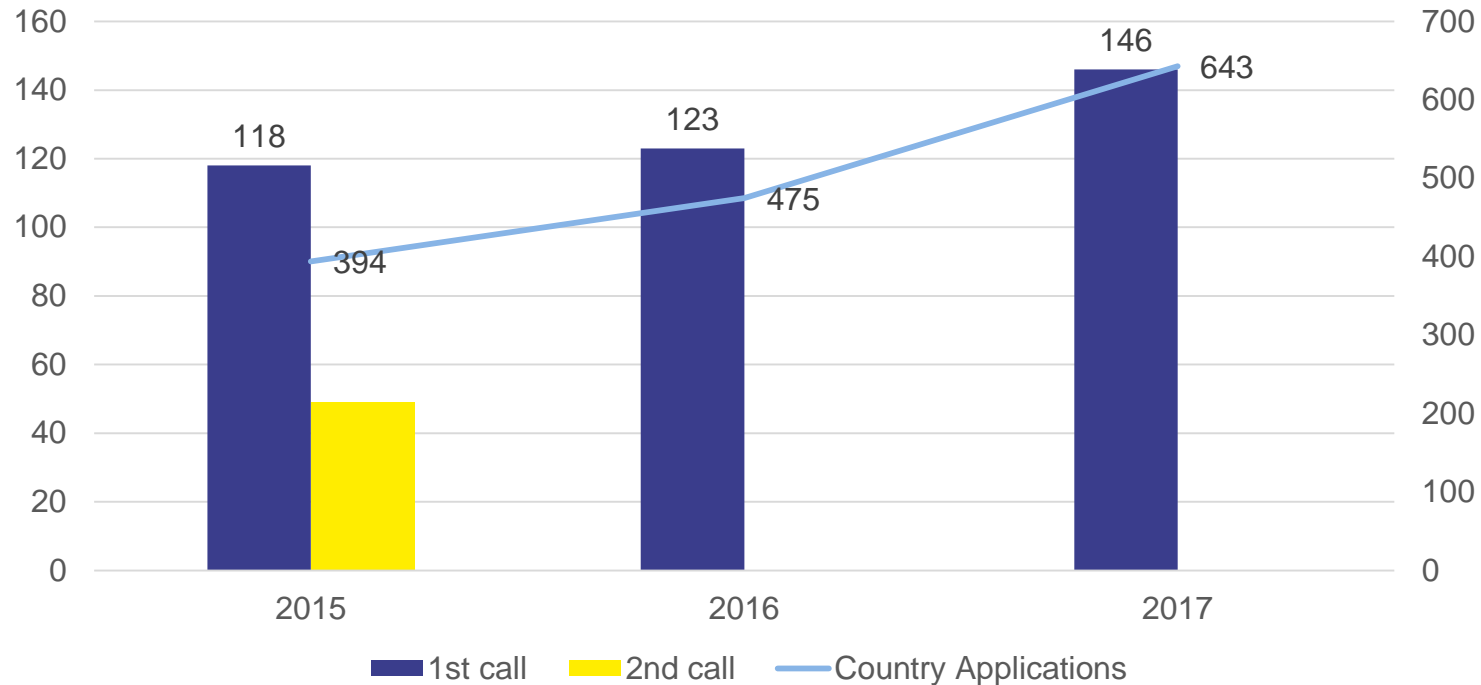
Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility (KA107) Overview

- Assessment preparation for months
- Each project assessed by two experts (1.286 assessments of country applications in 2017)
- Pool of experts: NA external; Executives of HEI
- Ø results: 2015: 79,9
