



Boğaziçi University


Istanbul Technical University

WORKSHOPS

Workshop 1: Building Your IHE Career Through Strategic Professional Development February 27, Tuesday/ 15:00- 16:30
Pearl Room

Brief description: This workshop will cover several aspects of growing one's career in international education. This topic is key to the sustainability of the international office and also addresses equity of access to opportunities which would allow one to grow in their international role. The workshop will explain why it is important to seriously consider opportunities for professional development (PD), the differences between formal and informal PD, accessing fee-paying and free opportunities, and considerations on how to approach one's supervisor for permission to engage in PD. It also provides practical examples of the range of competencies required for the job and offers some examples of free/low cost professional development to grow in international education competence.

Objectives/Learning Outcomes: The workshop aims to equip participants with

- a common framework for understanding the history, value and scope of the international education profession.
- information about the types of competencies required to successfully manage campus internationalization, as well as sharing opportunities for professional development both fee paying and free.
- tools to self-advocate internally for professional development

Target audience: Both newcomers and mid-career professionals can benefit from this workshop.

Facilitator: Sonja Knutson

Sonja Knutson has a dual role as scholar and as a practitioner at Memorial University, as both adjunct professor in the Faculty of Education and Director of the Internationalization Office. Her primary research interest is the role of campus internationalization office leadership and staff in engaging the campus community in transformative international/intercultural experiences.



WORKSHOPS

Workshop 2: Mainstreaming Sustainability Literacy in Eurasian Higher Education: Principles, Practices, and Assessment February 27, Tuesday/ 15:00-16:30 Amber Room

Brief description: This workshop addresses the great challenge Higher Education faces today: how to provide students with the ecoliterate knowledge, skills, and mindsets they need to both understand and effectively respond to today's unfolding climate and biodiversity crisis. Workshop trainers share good practice in how educators revise curriculum, use innovative and experiential pedagogies, and assess student learning in line with planetary boundaries, Donut Economics, and UN Sustainable Development Goals. Participants will leave both inspired and empowered to transform Higher Education in line with the hopes, needs, and employability of 21st century students.

Learning objectives: 1. Appreciate the importance and urgency with which HEIs must respond to the Earth crisis via meaningful curricular reform

- 2. Gain insight into innovative, experiential, and Earth-friendly pedagogies
- 3. Acquire knowledge of new assessment tools that support curricular revision and measure impact
- 4. Identify initiatives in sustainability education that are transferable to one's home campus
- 5. Become personally and urgently committed to ecoliterate teaching and learning across Higher Education in Eurasia

Target audience: Instructors and professors, International Office staff, Accreditation and quality assurance staff, University leadership

Facilitator: Scott G. Blair and Aurélien Decamps

Scott G. Blair, PhD, is Content Development Editor at Sulitest Impact, a social enterprise for assessing sustainability literacy in Higher Ed. He taught at Sciences Po, LanguesO, and UNH. He was the RD at Boston College Paris and Director of Assessment at TEAN and other U.S. providers. His research appears in Frontiers, Routledge, Stylus, and EAIE Forum publications. He is a regular speaker on assessment, eco-literacy, and program design via the UN SDGs. He holds degrees from the Sorbonne and Georgetown.

Aurélien Decamps is the Managing Director and co-founder at Sulitest Impact and co-founder of the Sulitest NGO aiming at mainstreaming Sustainability Literacy. He is passionate about transforming systems and organizations through the lense of sustainability. He holds academic positions as Affiliate professor at KEDGE Business School and Affiliate researcher at GREThA UMR CNRS 5113, University of Bordeaux. He is active in academic and professional networks such as UN HESI (Higher Education Sustainability Initiative) / SDSN (Sustainable Development Solutions Network) / UNEP Youth & Education Alliance / UNGC PRME (Principles for Responsible Management Education).

Prof. Olgun Çiçek is an International Expert in Quality Assurance & Accreditation and Rankings. Over the past three decades, he has contributed significantly to various Higher Education Institutions (HEIs), Quality Assurance Agencies (QAAs), Ministries, Councils, and Associations across more than ten countries within and beyond the European Higher Education Area. He is Board Member of INQAAHE (International Network for Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education) and hold leadership positions as Past-Vice President of CEENQA (Central and Eastern European Network of Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education) and Vice President of IQA.

He is elected as a member of the CHEA-CIQG (Council for Higher Education Accreditation' America) International Advisory Council, also holds the position of Accreditation Committee member at the British Accreditation Council (BAC).

Erik Martinjse, MA is Director at the Dutch Inspectorate of Education. He is an expert on quality assurance at the European level and on the level of Dutch Universities and the European Standards and Guidelines (ESG) in the European Higher Education Area. He is a member of the strategic board of Chain 5, a worldwide network geared towards quality assurance of Higher VET. He is also member of the advisory board of CHE (Dutch Polytechnic University , member of the board of the European University Institute in Florence and chair the International Advisory Board of Dokuz Eylul University.

"The Future of Higher Education"

Erol Özvar is a professor of economics and economic history. After graduating from Marmara University, he became a faculty member at the same university. His publications include a variety

of efforts to understand changes in economic and financial institutions in the Middle East and the Ottoman legacy of Türkiye in the early modern era. He was granted a fellowship at the Islamic finance project at Harvard Law School and spent three years as a visiting fellow there to study some projects between 2009 through 2011.

He is the author of "Life-Term Tax Farming in the Ottoman Finances" (Osmanlı Maliyesinde Malikane Uygulaması-Istanbul, 2004) which won the best book prize by Garanti Bank and the Ottoman Bank Archives and Research Center in Prize Competition for Research on History of Banking and Finance in 2005.

He also edited with Mehmet Genç the Ottoman budgets and financial data into two volumes, the Ottoman Finances: Institutions and Budgets-Istanbul, 2006 (Osmanlı Maliyesi: Kurumlar ve Bütçeler). This co-edited book was given International Halil Inalcik History Award in 2013.

He is a member of the Scientific Committee of the Turkish Historical Society, and an executive committee member of the International Association of Social and Economic History of Türkiye, and Fondazione Istituto Internazionale di Storia Economica F. Datini. He was elected as the President of the Higher Education Institution in Türkiye with the Presidential Decree dated July 30, 2021.

In an era characterized by increasing connectivity and globalization, universities play a pivotal role in preparing students for a diverse and interconnected world. The number of students studying abroad

has steadily increased over the years with the United States, the United Kingdom, Australia, Canada, and certain European countries being popular destinations. While these traditional study destinations remain popular, there is an increasing trend of students choosing non-traditional destinations in Asia, such as China and Singapore, due to the quality of education and diverse cultural experiences. Economic considerations, including the cost of education and opportunities for entry into the labor force, have also influenced student migration patterns. Academic collaborations and exchange programs between universities have also facilitated student mobility, with most of these partnerships aimed at providing students with a broader educational experience to become global citizens. The recent COVID-19 pandemic significantly disrupted global student migration by accelerating the adoption of online learning, leading to a rise in remote and hybrid models that have impacted the dynamics of international education. In order to succeed, international students need a core set of global competencies, skills and attributes, which will be explored in this session. Additionally, we shall discuss emerging innovative approaches and trends that are being used by institutions and organizations to address the evolving needs and experiences of these global students.

Transportation

Public transportation in Istanbul comprises of buses, various rail and metro systems, funiculars and maritime services. Cash payment is not accepted on public transportation. One-use tokens or a contactless smart card called Istanbulkart can be used for fare payment. Yellow taxis can be hailed on the street. They all have taximeters. Please keep in mind that the distance between any two points in Istanbul can be far and the traffic is very heavy during rush hour.

Around the venue

The neighbourhoods around the conference venue are leisure districts famous for cafes, restaurants, shops, museums, art galleries and streets with unique ambiance. Taksim Square is a main transportation hub and a popular destination for both tourists and the natives of Istanbul. Istiklal, a pedestrian street, showcases Art Nouveau and Neo-Classical Architecture, old consulate buildings and churches. Istiklal Street houses boutiques, music stores, bookstores, cinemas, as well as many options for dining and entertainment from patisseries to pubs. You can take the Nostalgic Tram to Tunel, stop by Pera Museum or have a drink at the Flower Market.

Right across the ICEC- Lutfi Kirdar is the Harbiye Military Museum. Just a short walk from the venue in the opposite direction of Taksim will take you to Niṣantaṣi, a luxury shopping and dining area. Down the hill and on the Bosphorus shore are the two special neighborhoods of Beşiktaş and Dolmabahçe. At Beşiktaş, you can visit the Naval Museum and then walk to the famous Dolmabahçe Palace, which served as the administrative seat of the Ottoman Empire in the late 19th and early 20th century. A new destination on the Bosphorus shore is Galataport which is a cruise port, a retail outlet with many dining options, as well as home to two must-see museums, Istanbul Modern and Istanbul Museum of Painting and Sculpture.







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
